CONDITIONS OF ENTRY.

Entries in Division A and B to be grown by Exhibitor.

Entries in Division C must have been owned by Exhibitor for a minimum of two (2) months. Entries received in Flower Pavilion between 11.00a.m. – 4p.m. 2nd May, Thursday and 7.45a.m. – 9.45a.m. Friday 3rd May. **Entries close at 9.45 a.m.** on Friday 3rd May at the Flower Pavilion.

Please fill out the **entry form** before arriving at the Flower Pavilion. You will be given a number and class entry cards on arrival at the pavilion door. The number will be your number for all your entries in 2024 in the Flower Pavilion at the Goondiwindi Show

NOTE WELL: EACH EXHIBITOR IS PERMITTED NO MORE THAN 4 ENTRIES IN EACH CLASS.

Flower Section Entry fee for Adult Sections: **GOLD COIN per EXHIBITOR** cards and ribbons for 1st, 2nd & 3rd

Flower Section - No entry fee for Juvenile Section ---cards and ribbons for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd.

Entry / Gate Fee to Show: Note all competitors pay entry to Annual Show

Because of public interest in your plants, would exhibitors PLEASE supply names (where possible) of blooms (particularly roses) and container plants, on the BACK of your entry ticket which you will receive at the Pavilion entrance.

NO TRAFFIC WILL BE ALLOWED at the FRONT of the Flower PAVILION at all on FRIDAY morning or throughout the show. DECORATIVE Exhibits and CHILDREN'S CREATURES and EXHIBITS can enter the new Pavilion side door and be positioned in their respective classes before filling out entry details at front door.

Please note that vehicle access within the show is prohibited, therefore, patrons and competitors will be requested to park in the designated carparks. This includes when entering or collecting your exhibits.

During the period of the Show all competitors are to pay the gate entrance fee. It is recommended that competitors consider purchasing a **Membership ticket which gives access to the Members Carpark and a discounted two-day ticket to the show.** The Member's Carpark has gated access directly to the pavilions, and this will allow for ease of access to deliver and enter your exhibits. Alternatively, competitors may wish to use the **drop off bay and use the general patrons ticket system.**

If you are unable to collect your entries on Saturday night, please speak to the steward in charge about collection on Sunday between 9am – 10.30 am or ask them to leave it at the office which will then re-open at 9:00am on Tuesday the 2nd of May 2024.

Note: Entries will only be held one week before being disposed of.

Trophies are presented on Saturday afternoon in Flower Pavilion at 4pm

1. A POT is a round, deep container.
2. DISTINCT means each bloom must be different.
3. A CONTAINER is any vessel suitable for holding cut plant material.
4. AN ARRANGEMENT - any plant material container and/or base arranged in a design which follows art principles.
5. Please supply your own containers (bottles are provided for cut flower divisions).
6. **PLEASE READ THE SCHEDULE CAREFULLY.** Every care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility accepted. Grand Champion Exhibit can only be selected from first place winners in that division.
7. **All flowers in Div1 and Div 2 must be blooms from your own garden.**
8. **The display in the Flower Pavilion will NOT be dismantled until 5 p.m.** Saturday May 4th. If dismantling your display on Saturday during Show Hours, all competitors will be required to pay the gate entrance fee to the show. Alternate hours are available in clause 9, below should competitors not wish to purchase entry for the day of collection.
9. Please **don't ask** to remove your exhibit before the appointed time. The pavilion will be opened between 9a.m. and 10.30 a.m. on Sunday for you to collect your flowers and containers or your containers will be left at the Show Office for you to collect over the following week.
10. THE JUDGES DECISION IS FINAL.

DIVISION A - ROSES.

N.B. One cut of any single bloom should NOT have a bud but must include some foliage. NO WIRING OF BLOOMS IS ALLOWED, BUT OTHER BLOOM SUPPORT PERMITTED such as small pieces of plastic tubing. This support is very necessary to hold the flower exhibit up high for presentation.

1. MOST PERFUMED ROSE—please name (if possible)—rose can be any variety, at any stage, and purely judged on perfume. *Trophy* -Mr. Ran Mitchell & the late Jenny Mitchell
2. ONE RED ROSE. *Trophy*- *Susie Kelly* In memory of Mrs. B. McIntosh.
3. ONE PINK ROSE. *Trophy*- Mrs. Di Sheinberg.
4. ONE YELLOW ROSE. *Trophy*- Mrs. Bev Coulton.
5. ONE WHITE ROSE. *Trophy*- *A. Russell in memory of Mary Russell*
6. ONE ROSE, any other colour or colours but red, pink, white or yellow.

7. ONE ROSE blended- colour.
Trophy- Mrs. Marg McIntosh in memory of Ruth Bowman
8. ROSE IN THREE (3) STAGES (bud, half open, full bloom, stems in one container, need not be originating from one stem). *Trophy* -Mrs. Jill Gloster
9. ONE FULL BLOWN ROSE. *Trophy*- Mrs. Cathy Waugh
10. ONE BLOOM OLD FASHIONED TYPE ROSE.
11. ONE STEM of OLD-FASHIONED ROSE
12. VASE of OLD-FASHIONED ROSES (3 or more).
13. ONE STEM of DAVID AUSTIN ROSE
14. VASE of DAVID AUSTIN ROSES (3 or more)
Trophy- Mrs. Gloria Cory from **classes 10-14** for best exhibit.
15. ONE STEM (cut/head) of florabunda rose.
16. ONE STEM (cut/head) of miniature rose.
17. CONTAINER of florabunda or miniature roses (3 or more).
Trophy. – Marilyn Uebergang from classes 15-17 for best exhibit
18. BEST COLLECTION of ROSES (at least FOUR (4) different colours) of your choice.
Trophy—Aitches Boutique. Foliage MUST be ROSE foliage, preferably with enough on each stem without being excessive.

CHAMPION ROSE. To be chosen from Classes 2-8

THE FALCON COURT ROSES PERPETUAL TROPHY – for Champion Rose of the Show, perpetual trophy donated by D.& L. Leadbetter.

RESERVE CHAMPION ROSE. *Trophy* –Mrs Jean Dight.

DIVISION B – CUT FLOWERS.

1. N.B. One cut of any single bloom should NOT have a bud! NO WIRING OF BLOOMS ALLOWED, BUT OTHER SUPPORT PERMITTED such as small pieces of plastic tubing. This support is necessary for Gerberas so that the exhibit is held up high for presentation.

19. THREE (3) DISTINCT CHRYSANTHEMUM BLOOMS, staged in ONE container.
(one bloom per stem).
20. CHRYSANTHEMUMS – 3 of a kind, staged in one container.
21. ONE BLOOM or SPRAY of any Chrysanthemum not specified elsewhere in Div. B.
22. THREE STEMS (sprays) CHRYSANTHEMUMS (distinct colours and/or varieties of Chrysanthemums staged in one container).
23. ONE SPRAY miniature Chrysanthemum.
24. ONE CONTAINER of miniature Chrysanthemums
25. CACTUS DAHLIA EXHIBIT
26. DECORATIVE DAHLIA EXHIBIT
27. POM POM DAHLIA EXHIBIT
28. Any DAHLIA EXHIBIT not mentioned above
29. THREE (3) GERBERAS
30. ONE GERBERA (Double)
31. ONE GERBERA (Single)
32. ONE NEW VOGUE GERBERA
33. ONE GERBERA of any other variety not specified above
34. SPECIMEN GERANIUM /PELARGONIUM with leaf.
35. SPECIMEN of any other flower not in Classes 19-34
36. SPECIMEN of a *Decorative* LEAF
37. SPECIMEN spike, truss of BOUGAINVILLEA – any variety-must be able to be displayed upright
38. THREE cuts of BOUGAINVILLEA – 3 different colours.
39. ONE spike, truss, or cut of any specimen of any variety **not specified**.
40. COLLECTION of EUCALYPTUS cuts and may include blossom and nut- a min. of 3 different cuts.
41. COLLECTION of NATIVE SHRUBBERY (excluding Section 40 exhibits) – a min. of 3 different cuts.
42. SHRUBBERY of your choice (a min of 3 different cuts) – flowering / non flowering / berries / fruit – in container.
43. MIXED COLLECTION of FLOWERS & SHRUBBERY of your choice.

CHAMPION CHRYSANTHEMUM EXHIBIT. Chosen from Classes 19-24. The Champion Chrysanthemum may be a SINGLE bloom or a SPRAY. *Trophy*- Goondiwindi Floor Coverings

CHAMPION DAHLIA EXHIBIT Chosen from classes 25-28. *Trophy* donated by Mrs. Robyn Lucas

CHAMPION GERBERA EXHIBIT. Chosen from Classes 29-33 *Trophy* donated by Mrs. H. Dimond

DIVISION C – PLANTS IN CONTAINERS/POTS/BASKETS.

Pot Plants can be delivered on Thursday afternoon between 11am and 4pm.

NOTE WELL 4 exhibits per class limit.

N.B. The plants must be presented in their own pot not in a second pot or basket to make it look better.

44. POT or HANGING BASKET of MAIDEN HAIR.
45. POT or HANGING BASKET of ANY other FERN.
46. BONSAI
47. INDOOR PLANT (flowering/ non flowering) in container.
48. PLANT in HANGING BASKET other than a fern.
49. BEGONIA – flowering / non-flowering – in container.
50. BROMELAID
51. Any other POT PLANT not in schedule above.
52. SUCCULENT or CACTUS
53. COLLECTION of SUCCULENTS and or CACTUS

DIVISION D – DECORATIVE OPEN.

This Division is OPEN to all. Welcomed are entries from Groups, Home Gardeners, Organizations, Businesses, Florists, Individuals, etc. Flowers may be bought and/or imported for this Division. Any type of foliage is allowed provided it complies with the class. Any embellishment allowed. *All arrangements must be principally fresh flowers and greenery.*

N.B. OASIS MUST BE DISGUISED IN ALL ARRANGEMENTS.

Definition- LINE – Strong linear pattern or outline. Line is the primary foundation of design using a minimum of plant material.

LINE MASS or MASSED LINE – A quantity of material used to form one quite discernible line, the quantity giving greater depth and width.

BASKET of FLOWERS arrangements – must be of good design with stems to be in water or oasis.

FREE STYLE- An imaginative use of horticultural material which may include long lasting material that can be used out of water e.g. Camellias, Proteas, Flax, Cacti, Succulents etc.

FREE EXPRESSION—An imaginative use of horticultural material as above but feature two points of visual impact.

POT-et -FLEUR—combining living houseplants with cut flowers. Check it out on Google. Great fun and free spirit arranging and no rules.

Theme for Flower Pavilion is---BRIGHT IDEAS *Some sections specifically relate to this theme so enjoy with creativity!!!*

NB, SOME CLASSES THIS YEAR PERMIT ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS. NO PLASTIC FLOWERS.

54. LINE ARRANGEMENT – any Bright Ideas (Could be in a bright vase or Ikebanba arrangement (to be viewed from the front) *Trophy* – Lorna Logan memorial perpetual trophy with memento.
55. An ARRANGEMENT – a collection of bright coloured flowers tastefully presented and any embellishment permitted. *Trophy* – Doyle Family in memory of Mabel

56. An ARRANGEMENT featuring an Old Picture Frame – BRIGHT and BEAUTIFUL IDEAS and may feature either / or both artificial or fresh flowers – any suitable embellishment permitted.

57. FREE EXPRESSION – Any BRIGHT IDEAS. This can be presented on a base up to 60cms square with your chosen embellishments and flowers and foliage. (to be viewed from the front)

60. CHRYSANTHEMUMS in your basket (informal or formal) (embellishments permitted)

61. Create A SUCCULENT PICTURE on a large pot plant saucer or alfoil tray (accessories are permitted).

62. An ARRANGEMENT in WHITE and GREEN for the hallway table
