CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

Entries in Division A and B to be grown by Exhibitor.

Entries in Division C must have been owned by Exhibitor for a minimum of two (2) months.

Entries received in Flower Pavilion between 11:00am - 4:00pm Thursday 2nd May and 7:45am - 9:45am Friday 3rd May. **Entries close at 9:45am** on Friday 3rd May at the Flower Pavilion.

Please fill out the **entry form** from the rear of your Show schedule before arriving at the Flower Pavilion. You will be given a number and class entry cards on arrival at the pavilion door. The number will be your number for all your entries in 2019 in the Flower Pavilion at the Goondiwindi Show.

Entry Fee for Adult Sections: **GOLD COIN per EXHIBITOR** (cards & ribbons for 1st, 2nd and 3rd).

No Entry Fee for Juvenile Section (cards and ribbons for 1st, 2nd and 3rd).

Because of public interest in your plants, would exhibitors **PLEASE** supply names (where possible) of blooms (particularly roses) and container plants, on the **BACK** of your entry ticket which you will receive at the Pavilion entrance.

Trophies are presented on Saturday afternoon in Flower Pavilion at 4:00pm

1. **A POT**, is a round, deep container.
2. **DISTINCT**, means each bloom must be different.
3. **A CONTAINER**, is any vessel suitable for holding cut plant material.
4. **AN ARRANGEMENT**, any plant material container and/or base arranged in a design which follows art principles.
5. Please supply your own containers (bottles are provided for cut flower divisions).
6. **PLEASE READ THE SCHEDULE CAREFULLY.** Every care will be taken of exhibits but no responsibility accepted. Grand Champion Exhibit can only be selected from first place winners in that division.
7. **ALL FLOWERS IN DIV 1 AND 2 MUST BE BLOOMS FROM YOUR OWN GARDEN.**
8. **The display in the Flower Pavilion will NOT be dismantled until 6:00pm Saturday 4th May, 2019.**
9. Please **don't ask** to remove your exhibit before the appointed time. The pavilion will be opened between 9:00am and 9:30am on Sunday for you to collect your flowers and containers or your containers will be left at the Show Office for you to collect.

DIVISION A - ROSES.

N.B. One cut of any single bloom should NOT have a bud, but must include some foliage. **NO WIRING OF BLOOMS IS ALLOWED, BUT OTHER BLOOM SUPPORT PERMITTED, such as small pieces of plastic tubing.** This support is very necessary to hold the flower exhibit up high for presentation.

- Class 1** Most Perfumed Rose. Please name - rose can be any variety, at any stage, and purely judged on perfume. ***Trophy Mr. & Mrs. Ran Mitchell.***
- Class 2** One Red Rose. ***Trophy Susie Kelly, In memory of Mrs. B. McIntosh.***
- Class 3** One Pink Rose. ***Trophy in memory of Mavis Blomley .***
- Class 4** One Yellow Rose. ***Trophy Mrs. Bev Coulton.***
- Class 5** One White Rose. ***Trophy A .Russell in memory of Mary Russell***
- Class 6** One Rose, any other colour or colours but red, pink or yellow. ***Trophy Mrs G. Cory***
- Class 7** One Rose, blended - colour. ***Trophy Border Builders***
- Class 8** Rose in Three (3) Stages (bud, half open, full bloom, stems in one container, need not be originating from one stem). ***Trophy Mrs. Jill Gloster***

- Class 9** One Full Bloom Rose. *Trophy Mrs. Cathy Waugh*
- Class 10** One Bloom Old Fashioned Type Rose.
- Class 11** One Stem of Old Fashioned Rose.
- Class 12** Vase of Old Fashioned Roses. (3 or more).
- Class 13** One Stem of David Austin Rose.
- Class 14** Vase of David Austin Roses. (3 or more) *Trophy Border Builders, from classes 10-14 for best exhibit.*
- Class 15** One Stem, (cut/head) of florabunda rose
- Class 16** One Stem, (cut/head) of miniature rose, *from classes 15-17 for best exhibit.*
- Class 17** Container of Florabunda or Miniature Roses (3 or more).
Trophy J&B Whitmee in memory of May Whitmee,
- Class 18** Best Collection of Roses. (at least FOUR (4) different colours) of your choice.
Trophy Aitches Boutique. Foliage **MUST** be ROSE foliage, preferably with enough on each stem without being excessive.

DIVISION B – CUT FLOWERS

N.B. One cut of any single bloom should NOT have a bud! **NO WIRING OF BLOOMS ALLOWED.**
BUT OTHER SUPPORT PERMITTED such as small pieces of plastic tubing. This support is necessary for Gerberas so that the exhibit is held up high for presentation.

- Class 19** One Bloom Exhibition Chrysanthemum (small)
- Class 20** One Bloom Exhibition Chrysanthemum (large)
- Class 21** One Bloom Spider Chrysanthemum.
- Class 22** One Bloom Quill Chrysanthemum.
- Class 23** Three (3) Distinct Chrysanthemum Blooms, staged in ONE container (one bloom per stem).
- Class 24** Chrysanthemums, 3 of a kind, staged in one container.
- Class 25** One Bloom or Spray of any Chrysanthemum not specified elsewhere in Div. B.
- Class 26** Three Stems (sprays) Chrysanthemums (distinct colours and/or varieties of Chrysanthemums staged in one container)
- Class 27** One Spray Miniature Chrysanthemum.
- Class 28** One Container of Miniature Chrysanthemums
- Class 29** Three (3) Gerberas.
- Class 30** One Gerbera (Double)
- Class 31** One Gerbera (Single)
- Class 32** One New Vogue Gerbera
- Class 33** One Gerbera, of any other variety not specified above.
- Class 34** Specimen Geranium/Pelargonium, with leaf.
- Class 35** Specimen of any Other Flower, not in Classes 19-34
- Class 36** Specimen of a *Decorative* Leaf.
- Class 37** Specimen Spike, Truss of Bougainvillea. Any variety, must be able to be displayed upright.
- Class 38** Three cuts of Bougainvillea. (3 different colours)
- Class 39** One Spike, Truss or Cut of any Specimen, of any variety not specified.
- Class 40** Collection of Native Shrubbery.
- Class 41** Shrubbery of your choice (3 distinct cuts). Flowering/non flowering/berries/fruit - in container.
- Class 42** Mixed Collection of Flowers and Shrubbery, of your choice.

Champion Chrysanthemum Exhibit. (chosen from classes 19-28)

The Champion Chrysanthemum may be a SINGLE bloom or a SPRAY.

DIVISION C – PLANTS IN CONTAINERS/POTS/BASKETS

N.B. The plants must be presented in their own pot not in a second pot or basket to make it look better.

Class 43 Pot or Hanging Basket, of Maiden Hair.

Class 44 Pot or Hanging Basket, of any other Fern.

Class 45 Bonsai

Class 46 Indoor Plant, (flowering/non flowering) in container.

Class 47 Plant in Hanging Basket, other than a Fern.

Class 48 Begonia, (flowering/non flowering) in container.

Class 49 Bromelaid

Class 50 Any other Pot Plant, not in schedule above.

Class 51 Succulents or Cactus, in complimentary container.

Class 52 Collection of Succulents or Cactus. (chosen from classes 51-52) *Trophy - Goondiwindi Floor Coverings*

Champion Plant's in container or basket. (chosen from classes 45-50)
Trophy – Mackenzies Home Timber and Hardware

Champion Fern (hanging or standing) (chosen from classes 43-44)
Trophy – Border Builders and Plumbers Supplies

DIVISION D – DECORATIVE OPEN

This Division is OPEN to all. Welcomed are entries from Groups, Home Gardeners, Organizations, Businesses, Florists, Individuals, etc. Flowers may be bought and/or imported for this Division. Any type of foliage is allowed provided it complies with the class. Any embellishment allowed. *All arrangements must be principally fresh flowers and greenery.*

N.B. OASIS MUST BE DISGUISED IN ALL ARRANGEMENTS.

Definitions:

Line - Strong linear pattern or outline. Line is the primary foundation of design using a minimum of plant material.

Line Mass or Massed Line - A quantity of material used to form one quite discernible line, the quantity giving greater depth and width.

Basket of Flowers Arrangements - Must be of good design with stems to be in water or oasis.

Free Style - An imaginative use of horticultural material which may include long lasting material that can be used out of water e.g. Camellias, Proteas, Flax, Cacti, Succulents etc.

Free Expression - An imaginative use of horticultural material as above but feature two points of visual impact.

Theme for Flower Pavilion is XMAS—some classes will be specifically related to this theme so enjoy with creativity! NOTE: SOME CLASSES THIS YEAR PERMIT ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS. NO PLASTIC FLOWERS.

Class 53 Line Arrangement featuring White or Red Flowers or both and Green (to be viewed from the front). *Trophy – Lorna Logan memorial perpetual trophy with memento.*

Class 54 An Arrangement featuring Flowers, Bells and Tinsel, any embellishment permitted.
Trophy - Mrs. M. Uebergang

Class 55 An Arrangement featuring an Old Picture Frame - BLOOMING BEAUTIFUL and may feature either/or both artificial or fresh flowers- any suitable embellishment permitted.
Trophy—Fairway Studios.

- Class 56** Free Expression... XMAS. This can be presented on a base up to 60cms square with your chosen embellishments and flowers and foliage. (to be viewed from the front) **Trophy - Mrs Joan Elder.**
- Class 57** A XMAS WREATH Artificial Flowers and complimentary Xmas accessories permitted (to be viewed from front). **Trophy in memory of Mrs. Gloria Glasser**
- Class 58** Set the XMAS TABLE - must include candles, nuts and flowers... can be formal or informal. **Trophy Mrs. Val Richardson**
- Class 59** CHRYSANTHEMUMS and CANDLES for a formal Xmas Table (embellishments permitted). **Trophy - Goondiwindi Floor Coverings**
- Class 60** WALKING down the GARDEN PATH with SUCCULENTS with Xmas in the air - any complimentary embellishments such as pods, cones, berries, bark, stones etc. **Trophy - The Doyle Family, In memory of Mabel**
- Class 61** An ARRANGEMENT in WHITE and GREEN for the hallway table at Xmas time... Coloured centres, stamens etc. are permitted. **Trophy - Mrs Vicki Murphy.**
- Class 62** A Xmas stocking full of Mixed Foliage - green seed heads and/or bracts are allowed. **Trophy - Mrs. M. Marshall.**
- Class 63** SOLITARY SPLENDOUR, a single flower or spike with a splash of red and white with any embellishments either natural/ribbons, etc. **Trophy - Goondiwindi Floor Coverings.**

DIVISION E-NOVICE

For new exhibitors or persons under 20 years of age.

- Class 64** A MIXED FOLIAGE arrangement in a Xmas Stocking, embellishments permitted. **Trophy - Mrs. G. Cory**
- Class 65** XMAS TABLE ARRANGEMENT including a candle **Trophy - Mrs. G Cory.**
- Class 66** GOING SOLO - a single flower/spike arrangement with splashes of red and white with unlimited foliage and embellishments. **Trophy—Mrs. G Cory**
- Class 67** There is a XMAS TREE in my garden... Free Expression. **Trophy - Mrs. G Cory.**

Definitions:

Decorated Saucer, or similar disposable plastic plate - Should consist of an arrangement of flowers and/or foliage and/berries. The saucer need not be completely covered. Any embellishments permissible. Shape can be flat, convex or concave. Usually done in wet sand.

Miniature Garden – Plant material used to represent a small garden. Can be in a low bowl, small container or tray (approx. 41cm x 31cm). All plant material used to be in water-retaining material, e.g. oasis, wet sand.

Creature - Made from plant material, fruit, seeds, cabbage, other vegetables, tooth picks, twiggy bits, pipe-cleaner etc. *If you would like to name your creation, a small card with details would be welcome for display purposes.*

Necklace - Made of plant material. Berries, seeds, small flowers of good lasting quality, etc., on suitable thread. To resemble a necklace. A display frame - A4 frame size will be provided.

Tea Cup Arrangement - Use tea cup or similar disposable cup/mug as container. View from all sides.
